Vaccine Clinic Volunteer Effort "Mission Accomplished"

On March 13, 2020, the Covid-19 Pandemic forced our Auxiliary into what became a nearly yearlong hiatus. As abrupt and unsettling as our departure from TCMC was, our return, as a volunteer force supporting the Vaccine Clinic, was a complete triumph as we returned in three areas of service. Under the steady leadership of First Vice President, now President, Linda Wolff, a dedicated and hardworking group of Auxilians took up the effort of welcoming and assisting community members coming to TCMC for Covid-19 vaccination.

The first of our Auxilians to meet the community were the Courtesy Shuttle drivers, led by Rita Gross. Taking on the difficult task of answering phones and assisting with scheduling was our third group of volunteers led by Bunny McElliott. These three individuals were indispensable in the overall effort to vaccinate our local community.

Statistics alone do not tell the full story, but they are helpful in appreciating the breadth of this effort. Here is what some might call the "bottom line."

The TCMC Vaccine Clinic operated on 58 days between February 19 and June 15, working 102 four-hour shifts. There were 72 individuals working the Clinic, 11 volunteers working the Phone Program, and 10 Shuttle drivers for a total of 93 dedicated Auxilians. Be sure to read the *Vaccine Healthcare Heroes* article on Page 4 for the names of each Auxilian involved in this tremendous undertaking.

This magnificent group logged an amazing number of volunteer hours in service to the Tri-City Hospital community. There were 4,198 hours in the Vaccine Clinic, 850 hours by the Phone Program, and 662 hours by Courtesy Shuttle drivers. This is an astounding 5,710 volunteer hours in just four short months.

As Linda Wolff stated so elegantly in a recent letter to the Clinic volunteers, this was an amazing opportunity for Auxilians to make new friends and learn more about each other. Truth be told, it wasn't all work. Please take a moment to enjoy some of the fun moments captured in the pictures on this and the opposite page.

As most Auxilians know, we are a fun-loving group. We hope you enjoy a few of the lighter moments during the Vaccine Clinic captured in pictures for all to see.






























Vaccine Healthcare Heroes
